Colorado Republican Leaders Appointed to Board of National Federation of Republican Women

ALEXANDRIA, Va. – Three Colorado Republican women leaders will serve on the Board of Directors of the National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW) in 2024-2025.

As president of the Colorado Federation of Republican Women (CFRW), **Judith Jergensen** of **Black Forest**, **CO**, is a voting member of the NFRW Board of Directors.

Joining Judith, NFRW President Julie Harris has appointed Marty Neilson of Lyons, CO to Bylaws Committee, which is responsible for Review and Update of NFRW Bylaws, and Barbara Piper of Lone Tree, CO to the Membership Committee, responsible for membership outreach and growth. Barbara is the Immediate Past President of Colorado Federation of Republican Women, and Marty is also a Past President of CFRW.

The NFRW board met March 14-16 in the Washington, D.C., area to conduct organizational business, prepare for the upcoming elections, and receive updates on Capitol Hill from Republican elected officials, including U.S. Sens. Katie Bitt (AL), Cindy Hyde-Smith (MS), Cynthia Lummis (WY), Ted Budd (NC) and John Cornyn (TX).

"Republican women have an impactful and ambitious agenda in 2024," Harris said. "We are contributing millions of volunteer hours to reclaim the White House, achieve a stronger majority in the U.S. House, and regain control of the U.S. Senate. And we are advocating to secure the border, strengthen the economy, and protect parental rights. We are pleased that Marty will play a key role in these efforts by sharing her talents and ideas with our members across the nation."

Building leaders, energizing communities and keeping America strong, the NFRW empowers women from all backgrounds in the political process and provides a forum for women to serve as leaders in the political, government, and civic arenas. We have starting the planning the District retreat that we are hosting in June.


OURAY RW Patty Blackford, President
